

CASCADES CLUB MINUTES
JUNE 27, 1989

1. The regular meeting of the Cascades Club Executive took place on June 27, 1989 at 8:00 P.M. Present were Chris Holloway, Pres.; Doug Taylor, Vice Pres.; Chris Beasley, Secy.; and Murray McAllindon, Treas.
2. The first item of discussion was the annual beef BBQ, which took place on Saturday, June 10, 1989. The proceeds were as follows:

Chris Beasley was reimbursed \$76.60 for soft drinks (included in \$345.01 groceries, above). Doug Taylor was reimbursed \$23.90 for ground beef. Murray McAllindon is to pay Valumart for the groceries, beef and chicken.

Chris Beasley is to include in July's newsletter a thanks to Tina and Brian Tyrell for printing tickets for BBQ, and a thanks to Melva Wilson, Brenda Chevalier, Liz Bellerose, and ___?? for helping out at the BBQ.

Chris Holloway mentioned that local resident Mercedes Telles

wants to rent the Club for 13 weeks to teach a course on herbs, in conjunction with Heritage Campus, beginning in September. She offered to pay \$25.00 (or \$20.00 - CH to check) per night for one night per week.

4. Murray McAllindon mentioned that Dennis Hamel is cutting the grass as a swap for a squash membership. The last time he cut it, Lars Roberts and Murray raked the grass. Special thanks to Lars. Dennis is charging \$30 for each time he cuts. Murray proposed that the executive accept Dennis' offer. It was agreed by all present. However, any differences between price of squash and total we owe him for cutting the grass will be appropriately reimbursed.
5. Chris Holloway brought up the proposed arrangement with the Municipality. Mayor Judy Grant told Chris an arrangement cannot be set up at the present time. She will talk further to the Dir. of Recreation, Benoit Brunet.

It was decided by all present that Chris Holloway will write a letter to Mayor Judy Grant with cc to Benoit Brunet and Aurel Gervais (Dir. of Pub Works) outlining the plan.

The proposed plan is to enter into a reciprocal agreement with the municipality, whereby the municipality would be charged with snow plowing and grass cutting, in exchange for municipal recreational use of the club facilities.

The tennis survey was next discussed. Some results have returned. Only copies have been given out at the AGM--none have been mailed. Liz Bellerose and Tom Reid are refining it, based on discussions that took place during the AGM. This item is to be discussed again during the next meeting in July.

7. Chris Holloway raised the issues of (1) the proposed steps to be built at the front door; and (2) enclosing the verandah. He said that fundraising needs to be done, and suggested opening up more charter life memberships. This idea was vetoed by both D. Taylor and M. McAllindon. M. McAllindon said as a major expenditure, we have to focus on either the tennis courts or the deck. It was decided to focus on the tennis courts. However, the expense for building the steps is minimal. This project will go ahead, and will be organized later this summer by Jean Seguin.
8. Chris Beasley raised the question of the Tea Room for the West Hull Festival in August. It needs to be organized soon. This item is to be discussed further during the July meeting.
9. Murray McAllindon mentioned that the air conditioner for squash courts has been acting up, but is all right now.

10. Membership invoices and new fees were next discussed and decided upon, and prepared. The following shows the current (1988-89) fee structure, and the new (1989/90) fees: It was decided that the social fees would remain the same, and the squash fees initiation will be raised by approximately 6 per cent.
