
HSG AUCTION - AUGUST 18


Gatineau Heritage Lives at Wakefield Mill Inn

The history of the Wakefield Mill is characterized by many changes. From its inception in 1838, the Mill site has seen many buildings come and go, witnessed devastating fires and subsequent rebuilding, additions and renovations. During this time the Mill has changed hands many times and has functioned as a grist mill, woollen mill, apartments and a HSG operated museum. Throughout this history, the mill has been a notable aspect of the cultural geography of The Gatineau and has been important feature in the social fabric of the local community.

Today, the Wakefield Mill Inn is the latest incarnation of this important landmark. Opened in the spring of 2001, the Wakefield Mill Inn has once again become a focal point of the community and stands as a reminder of the past - a notion not lost on the current operators, Bob Millings and Lynn Berthiaume.
