

The Canadian Military History Gateway

On 30 June 2004, the Department of National Defence (DND) launched the Canadian Military History Gateway (CMHG), an online service that provides access to websites and digitized resources about Canada's military history.

The goal of the CMHG is to provide the public with free access to the collective military history resources of Canadian museums, libraries, archives and other heritage organizations through a single gateway. The Gateway provides Canada's military history dating back to 1000 A.D. It offers access to over 4000 online links to military history, with resources such as digitized books, music, art, photos and video, narratives, interactive games and scholarly research. The target audience - youth, educators and life long learners - can use online tools to access the military history resources of all the partners.

The Gateway was developed by the Department of National Defence (DND). It was done in partnership with Veterans Affairs Canada, Canadian War Museum, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC), National Film Board, Library and Archives Canada and Parks Canada.
