


Based on letters written by the author's parents, this book follows the exchanges between Joseph "Joe" McGoey of Martindale, and Sabina Carroll of Farrellton, from the mid-1920s to the mid-1940s.

Both of Irish extraction, their letters give us a glimpse of life in the upper Gatineau Valley, and later of their life in northern Ontario during that period. Both are now buried at St. Camillus Cemetery in Farrellton.




Up the Gatineau! Volume 48 ~ \$15.00


CD ~ Te Na Gadino ~ Ian Tamblyn ~ now only \$10.00








Historical Walks: The Gatineau Park Story (3rd edition) ~ \$20.00







