Search for History

The Society's activities can be divided into two categories: those which principally benefit the members, like meetings, tours and publications, and those which save our history. In the second category, our main activity is the research program known as Search for History in which we make modest grants to help cover expenses, and usually publish results.

Please consider that program, for we could be sponsoring far more research. One does not have to be a professional historian or writer: most applicants are not. It could be a family history, the recording of recollections of earlier Gatineau days, old photographs, diaries or other records. It could be anything which brings history alive and helps us save it before it is too late. We are especially interested in written or oral material about the activities of the Society itself, for we would like to publish some form of history to mark our 25th anniversary. If you have an idea you would like to pursue yourself, or know someone who could be interested, please tell any member of the executive. We should be doing more for the next generation.
