A Guided Tour of the Willson House

Monday, May 15, 7:00 p.m.

Members bare invited for a guided tour of the Willson House at Meech Lake, home of the first industrialist in the national capital region, T.L. (Carbide) Willson, and location of the Meech Lake Agreement on Canada's constitutional future in April 1987.

Katherine Fletcher, in her Historical Walks: The Gatineau Park Story, describes the Willson House, built in 1907, in these words: "a half-timbered, two-storey gabled summer house with two wood furnaces, seven fireplaces and eleven bedrooms-all [built] with local materials."

The house now serves as a federal government conference centre, and is normally closed to the public. This will be a rare chance to visit a building that is historic in several different ways. Access will be available through the NCC parking lot at the south end of Meech Lake and on up the hill. Don't confuse the O'Brien and Willson Houses - it is the Willson House that we are visiting.

AN INVITATION FROM THE AYLMER HERITAGE ASSOCIATION


