# WAKEFIELD COVERED BRIDGE PROJECT - An Update

- Finances: Recent special events and donations have brought the cumulative total of funds raised by the committee to over \$156,000. We have also benefitted greatly from gifts in kind and volunteers' time, now estimated to have reached a dollar value of \$250,000. Also, the National Capital Commission has formally agreed in writing to donate \$50,000 cash to our project; however this grant cannot be accessed until we have raised the balance of the funds required to complete the project.
- Government Grants: We have applied to the federal Department of Human Resources for up to five student workers under their current job creation program which commences on May 1st.
- Bridge Design: Boileau & Associés assumed engineering responsibility last spring and worked to finalize the main structural components in accordance with Transport Quebec's construction standards. Once completed, this allowed us to proceed with construction of the trusses.
- The First Truss: The first of four main trusses -- the principal supporting parts of a covered bridge -- has been completed. At 144 ft. in length with several hundred bolts, and weighing about ten tons, it is an impressive structure. Unfortunately, we were unable to complete the second truss last fall, as planned, because the supplier of specified timbers failed to meet our deadlines. As soon as we have the required lumber, we are confident that the remaining three trusses can be built in six weeks.
- Construction Site: The work site in the centre of the village has served us well, and many visitors have stopped by to view the plans and the work in progress. Although heavy snow in November hampered work, we built a shelter for the sawmill and continued to produce lumber for the roof trusses before closing down for the winter in mid-December.
- What's Next? This summer we will continue construction work and to acquire the building materials still needed. We have sufficient funds to buy the additional wood required for the trusses and the roof, but we are short an estimated \$130,000 to complete the project. Now we need the help of all our friends to raise the funds for this critical, final phase. With continued volunteer support and strong community and government participation, we will be able to erect the new Wakefield Covered Bridge this year.
