Special Event GUIDED TOUR OF GATINEAU MINES

Dr. Donald Hogarth, a devoted member of the Historical Society, has written several scholarly articles on mines and mining in the Lower Gatineau: "The Haycock Iron Mine" (vol. 10); "Stanislas Franchot and his Buckingham Mines" (vol. 24); and "West Hull's Phosphate Pits: Mines, Miners, and Motives" (vol. 25).

Here is a special opportunity for members. On **Saturday, June 19**, Dr. Hogarth will be conducting an all-day tour of four historically important mines in our area. They are:

- the Haycock phosphate and mica mine;
- the Forsyth iron mine on Mine Road;
- the Haycock iron mine in Cantley; and
- the Miller apatite pits, at Lac McGregor.

Bring your car and assemble at 9:30 a.m. in the Library parking lot, Chelsea, where you will receive a detailed itinerary and map. The group will then proceed in convoy.

You will need to bring a lunch, drinking water, geological hammers (if you like), and insect repellant. Dr. Hogarth advises participants to wear slacks and sturdy walking boots or shoes, and a hat. Don't forget your camera!

Note 1 Loan Receivable

Loan receivable consists of:

- Interest free loan of \$2,000.00 to Katharine Fletcher for the french publication of "Historical Walks: the Gatineau Park Story".

Note 2 Fixed Assets

Furniture

In 1997, a wooden display cabinet was purchased for \$500.00. It is expected to have a useful life of ten years. The cabinet will be depreciated on a straight line basis at the rate of 10% per year.

Note 3 Government Grant

A grant in the amount of \$4,900.00 for the publication: "In memory of the Chelsea Pioneer Cemeteries" by C. Martin was received in 1996. The book was not published in 1997 or 1998. It is expected 'that the book will be published in 1999.

Note 4 Other liabilities

Other liabilities consist of funds held in various trusts. The monies donated to each Fund can only be used for specific purposes as described in the various Trust Funds Memoranda. During 1998, the Executive Committee continued to co-mingle the various fund accounts in order to obtain a better rate of return.

Note 5 Unusual item: Forgivable Loan

In February 1998, it was decided that the interest free loan in the amount of \$6,000 to the Wakefield Bridge Committee would be forgiven. The loan is no longer considered as a receivable. In the Statement of Operations, it is shown as an Unusual Item.
